DOGS IN PLEASURE GROUNDS

TEIGNBRIDGE DISTRICT COUNCIL

Byelaws made by the District Council of Teignbridge under Section 164 of the Public Health Act 1875 and Section 83 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907, with regard to public walks, pleasure grounds open spaces and a promenade

EXTENT

- 1 (1) These byelaws apply to the public walks, pleasure grounds open spaces and the promenade named in the Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the grounds"
- (2) Notice of the effect of these byelaws shall be given by signs placed in conspicuous position on or near the grounds.

INTERPRETATION

2. (1) In these byelaws:
"the Council" means the Council of Teignbridge District
- (2) For the purpose of these byelaws the keeper of the dog shall be deemed in charge thereof, unless the Court is satisfied that at the time when the dog fouled the grounds it had been placed in or taken into the charge of some other person.
- (3) In paragraph (2) above "the keeper" shall include the owner of the dog or any person who habitually has it in his possession.

REMOVAL OF CANINE FAECES

3. Every person in charge of a dog (other than a registered blind person in charge of a dog) which is in the grounds who, without reasonable excuse, fails to remove forthwith from the grounds any faeces deposited by the dog shall be guilty of an offence .
4. For the purposes of compliance with byelaw 3 the following provisions shall apply:
 - (a) it shall be a sufficient removal from the grounds if the faeces are deposited in a receptacle within the grounds which has been provided for that purpose by the Council
 - (b) without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing it shall not be a reasonable excuse that a person in charge of the dog did not have with him any means of removal of ~~the faeces~~

DOGS ON LEADS

5. No person shall, without reasonable excuse, permit a dog to enter or remain in the ground unless the dog is held on a lead and is restrained from behaviour giving reasonable grounds for annoyance.

REMOVAL OF OFFENDERS

6. Any person offending against these byelaws may be removed from the grounds by any Officer of the Council or any Constable.

PENALTY

7. Any person offending against this byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale

8. (1) Byelaw number 10 of the series of byelaws made by the Urban District Council of Teignmouth on 1st February 1949 in respect of pleasure grounds is revoked insofar as they relate to The Den with effect from the date on which these byelaws come into operation
- (2) Byelaw number 9 of the series of byelaws made by the Urban District Council of Dawlish on 5th December 1956 in respect of pleasure ground is revoked insofar as they relate to The Lawn with effect from the date on which these byelaws come into operation

The "Grounds" referred to in Byelaw 1 are as follows:

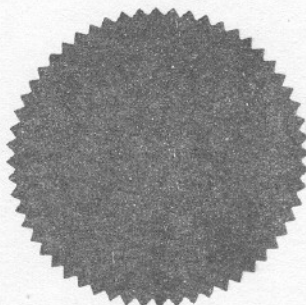
Name of Ground	Position of ground
The Lawn	Dawlish
Dawlish Warren	Two areas of land on either side of Beach Way, Dawlish Warren. The area on the south side being an open ground area bounded on the east by the Amusement Pavilion, on the south by the promenade and on the west by the Go Kart track. The area on the north side of Beach Way being an open area bounded on the north and east by footpaths serving Dawlish Warren and on the west by a Public Car Park
The Den	Teignmouth
The Promenade	Teignmouth
